Who Gemma Serves

Gemma provides steadfast support, expertise, and specialized services for some of the most vulnerable members of our communities, including children, teens, and families experiencing emotional and behavioral concerns. Those they serve often are impacted by loss, unexpected challenges, or serious traumas such as abuse, neglect, and addiction.

Programs & Services

Residential Treatment Program provides 24 / 7 clinical treatment, nurturing, and trauma focused care for children and youth ages 6 – 14 who have experienced traumas and / or significant emotional and behavioral difficulties. Gemma’s goal is to help them to heal, to learn new skills, and to reach their goals so they can return successfully to a home and community setting.

Education is provided through a licensed private academic school. The School’s overall objective is to help students reach their educational goals. Martin Luther School in Plymouth

Meeting, a Pennsylvania Approved Private School, provides special education for K – 12th grade for many of the children served by Gemma’s Residential Treatment program on the same Plymouth Meeting campus, and for community students referred from more than 45 area- school districts.

Community Based Programs provide an array of specialized services for children and families in community and home settings, including outpatient mental health services; foster family care; adoption; specialized behavioral health support in a child’s home or school; a Family Empowerment Center, and other in-home prevention services. The goal is to help children, youth, and families achieve their brightest future and to strengthen the communities Gemma serves.

Position Overview

Reporting to the President and CEO, the Chief Operating Officer serves as a key member of the leadership team and provides operational and clinical oversight to programs and services.

Oversees the daily operation of the organization and the development and implementation of programs and services. Develops strategic objectives for the organization and provides leadership to direct reports to assure the achievement of these objectives. Supports the CEO through various committees and activities, assuming responsibility for policy development, quality assurance, risk management, regulatory compliance, fiscal integrity and excellence in care, education, programs, and services.

Position Responsibilities

- Partners with CEO to lead the development and implementation of Gemma’s Strategic Plan. Oversees the development of departmental and program goals which support the strategic plan. Coordinates ongoing status updates on goals and ensures the achievement of short and long-term goals of the strategic plan.
- Partners with the CEO to represent Gemma with external constituency groups, including community, regulatory, governmental, and private organizations.
- Establishes collaborative and productive working relationships with funding agencies and regulatory bodies.
- Explores opportunities for enhancing and expanding current programs and services, streamlining services, and for pursuing new but related lines of service or business.

- Oversees the review, analysis, and development of new facilities, acquisitions, or management contracts.
- Provides effective leadership, as well as stewardship of Gemma by remaining actively involved in all programs, services, and program support functions and needs.
- Assists in the development of the annual budget and provides ongoing analysis and guidance on potential changes or adjustments needed to the budget based on changing external and internal factors. Conducts an ongoing analysis of revenues and expenses and reviews and approves changes in order to ensure the financial health of Gemma.
- Ensures that all program and organizational activities operate consistently and ethically within the mission and values of Gemma and in full compliance with all legal and regulatory requirements.
- Participates in the review of quality assurance standards and existing policies and procedures to ensure consistency with regulatory standards, governmental policies, and other such requirements. Evaluates the effectiveness of programs for risk aversion and liability reduction.
- Provides oversight to the implementation of quality performance measures and standards for clinical systems.
- Evaluates organizational design while adjusting systems and processes in response to changes in clinical and operational needs, licensing, program requirements and expansion.
- Identifies and develops resources required to reach clinical, programmatic, and operational goals. Identifies priorities and allocates resources accordingly.
- Develops Key Performance Indicators that measures the delivery of quality programs and services as well as the effectiveness of program support functions.
- Develops research policy and leads active organizational research agenda. Facilitates research meetings. Provides oversight to research projects.
- Ensures collaboration and holds employees accountable for providing quality services and exceptional care.
- Ensures staff comply with all regulatory and accreditation requirements as well as best practices, professional standards and internal policies and procedures.
- Provides and encourages opportunities for the professional development of staff and a healthy organizational culture.
- Develops data-taking mechanisms and reporting strategies for clinical information and operational processes.
- Ensures technology and data management play a key role in operational efficiency.
- Utilizes technology, systems, and processes to report, assess and improve clinical outcomes, operational processes, and program support functions.

- Motivates and leads a high-performance team by meeting with and mentoring staff at all levels.
- Promotes teamwork towards the achievement of goals.
- Recruits key staff (in conjunction with HR) to realize strategic objectives.
- Remains knowledgeable of market and industry trends, competitors, and all aspects of the field of behavioral health, autism, and intellectual disabilities.
- Conducts regular visitations to programs and services.
- Analyzes clinical, financial, utilization and incident data to identify opportunities for improving care and controlling cost.
- Serves as a liaison with partnering agencies, including state divisions and referral sources.
- Responsible for developing annual budget in conjunction with Finance. Monitors and maintains revenues and expenses consistent with approved budget.
- Ensures appropriate staffing, quality, safety, and customer satisfaction
- Performs other duties as assigned.

- Minimum of a master's degree in human services or a related field, BCBA credential and / or Licensed Clinical Psychologist preferred.
- Senior level management experience in a multi-state nonprofit preferred.
